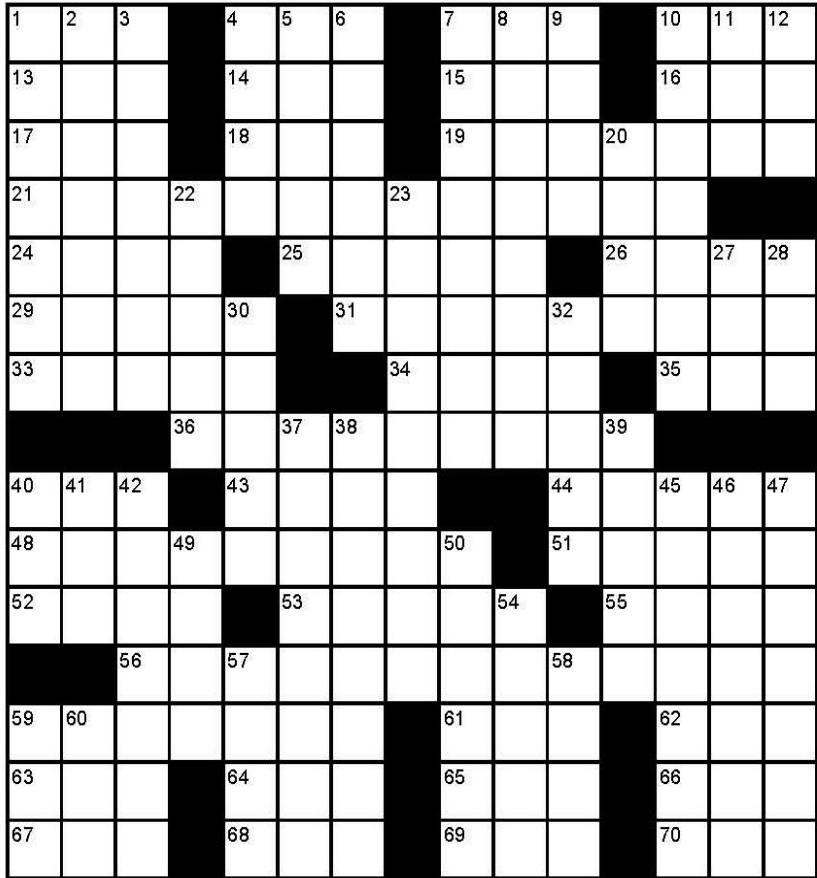

We are still taking applications for **Gillespie Senior Residences** in Gillespie on South and Gillespie St. You must be 55 years of age or older to qualify and in good standing with the Housing Authority. You can find the application online, you can call to request one to be mailed to you, or you can come into our office to pick one up.

Rent Ranges:

- 1 – Bedrooms will rent for \$417 per month
- 2 – Bedrooms will rent for \$550 per month
- *Rent amounts will be based on Income Guidelines and are the initial rents for the development.
- *All 20 apartments will have rental assistance vouchers provided if eligible

Income Guidelines:

- 1 - Person Family no more than \$28,980/yr
- 2 – Person Family no more than \$33,120/yr

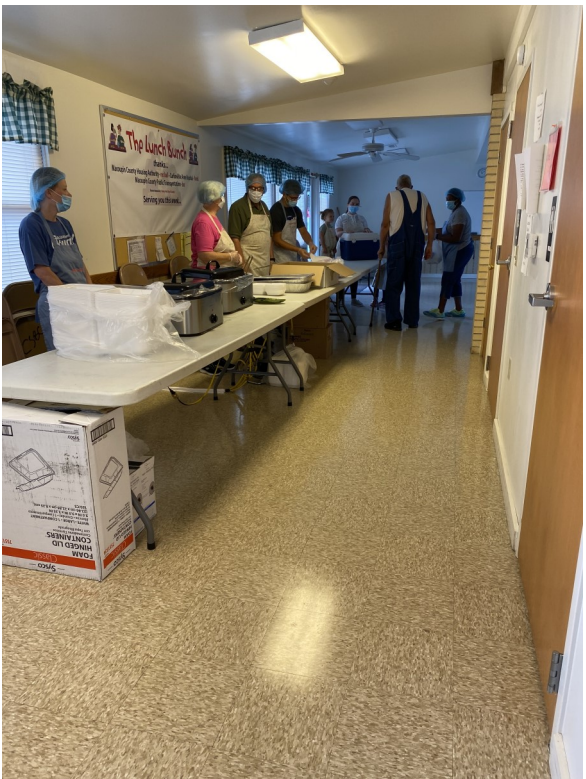
POST YOUR PET’S ID

All Pet Identification cards must be posted in the front door window of apartments. This lets housing staff know that a pet has been approved and may be inside the unit. In this case staff will be careful to close the door so the pet doesn’t get outside. If there is no ID in the window, staff will assume the pet has not been approved and the resident could face reprimand from the office.

If a Pet ID has become faded or is lost, the resident should call the Housing Office so staff can take a new picture and issue a new card.

Only an approved cat or dog is allowed in MCHA apartments

The Lunch Bunch program had a very successful run during June and July. They served about 3000 meals to both children and adults at the Carlinville Rec Hall. A big thanks to Carlinville Area Hospital for preparing the meals and to the many church volunteers who took time out of their day to help run the program.



Mowers will continue to mow this month. Remember to keep toys, trash, lawn chairs, etc. out of their way. Keep children away from the mowers. Flower beds should be weeded and up next to the buildings with fencing to prevent accidental mowing.

Macoupin County Housing Authority is a **smoke free agency**. No resident, visitor, contractor, employee, or any other person is allowed to use prohibited tobacco products in any building or on any grounds owned by MCHA. Each MCHA property is designated as a smoke free campus. Violation of the smoke-free policy by residents or their visitors will be considered a breach of the lease and may be grounds for eviction. This includes Medical and Recreational Marijuana.
