



February 12, 2022 would be Abraham Lincoln's 213th birthday. Across Illinois, Lincoln is celebrated and regarded for being a hometown hero and the 16th President of the United States. It is widely known Abe was a self-taught lawyer, he was instrumental in the Civil War and having the 13th Amendment passed, outlawing slavery in the U.S., and he was assassinated by John Wilkes Booth. But did you know these facts?

- Lincoln was the first president to be born outside of the original 13 colonies. He was born in Kentucky in 1809.
- Lincoln was the first president to be photographed at his inauguration. John Wilkes Booth, his assassin, can be seen standing close to Lincoln in the picture.
- The contents of Abe's pockets on the night of the assassination weren't revealed until February 12, 1976. His pockets contained two pairs of spectacles, a chamois lens cleaner, an ivory and silver pocketknife, a large white Irish linen handkerchief (slightly used) with "A. Lincoln" embroidered in red, a gold quartz watch fob without a watch, a new silk-lined leather wallet containing a pencil, a Confederate five dollar bill, and news clippings of unrest in the Confederate Army, emancipation in Missouri, the Union Party platform of 1864, and an article on the presidency by John Bright.
- Lincoln created the Secret Service hours before his assassination. The service was actually created to combat widespread currency counterfeiting.




